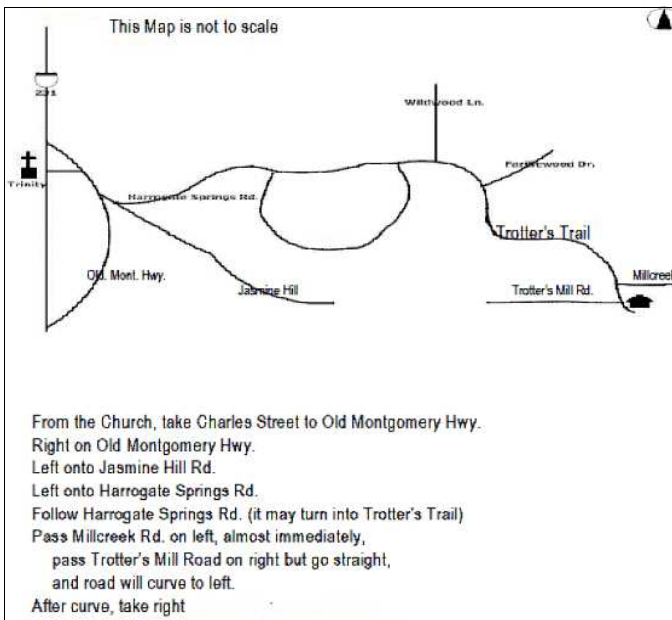

MAP TO THE WADSWORTH'S



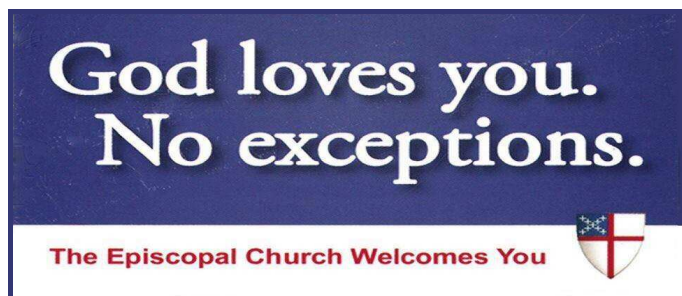
MOTHER/DAUGHTER BANQUET

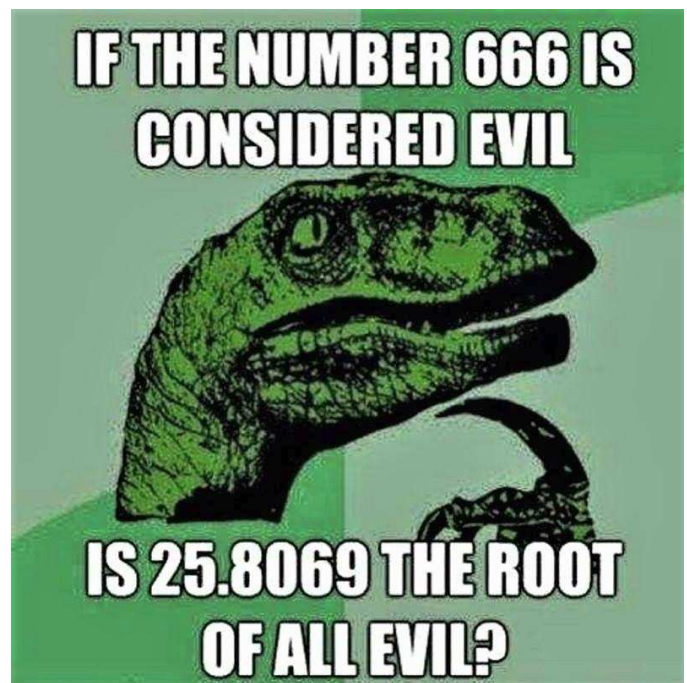
