Annual Parish Meeting

The annual Parish Meeting is scheduled for **Sunday, January 27**, in the Nave following the 10:30 Eucharist to be followed by Covered Dish Dinner in Trinity Hall.

We will elect Vestry members and hear reports about the activities of the Parish by various organizations and committees. All vestry members and committee representative will be available to answer questions about their reports.

Three new vestry persons will be elected to replace those rotating off – Lucie Wadsworth, Robert Quinn and Rhonda Baughman.

VESTRY NOMINATIONS

Nominations for the Vestry must be in writing or email and must include a statement that the person nominated has been contacted and has agreed to serve. This information should be given to or sent to the Parish Administrator, (warren@trinitywetumpka.org).

Nominations from the floor will be accepted; however, before making such a nomination, the nominator must insure that the nominee meets the criteria for Vestry persons:

The Canons state that persons eligible to service on the Vestry must:

- ✘ be an adult, confirmed communicant of Trinity Episcopal Church, (*i.e.*, 16 years of age or older);
- ✘ attend Church regularly;
- ✘ be in Good Standing (*having received communion at least 3 times in the previous year*);
- ✘ be known to the treasurer. (*In this parish, that means the person has made and maintained a stated financial commitment for parish support during the year prior to the year proposed for nomination, has made a pledge for the upcoming or current year and will continue to do so while serving on the Vestry*);

The Vestry and Rector require that all those nominated commit to:

- ✘ praying daily for the Rector and other Vestry Members, by name;
- ✘ making attendance at Vestry Meetings, Sunday service and parish events a Priority;
- ✘ accepting liaison responsibility for a committee or area of responsibility;
- ✘ serving as the Sunday vestry person of the day on a rotating basis;
- ✘ attending a vestry retreat on Friday Evening and Saturday, February 1-2.

We hope and pray:

that every person making the nomination gives their proposed nomination prayerful consideration; that no one will agree to be nominated without prayerful consideration; and, that those elected will be actively involved in the life and work of the church.

Please pray for the nominating and electing process.

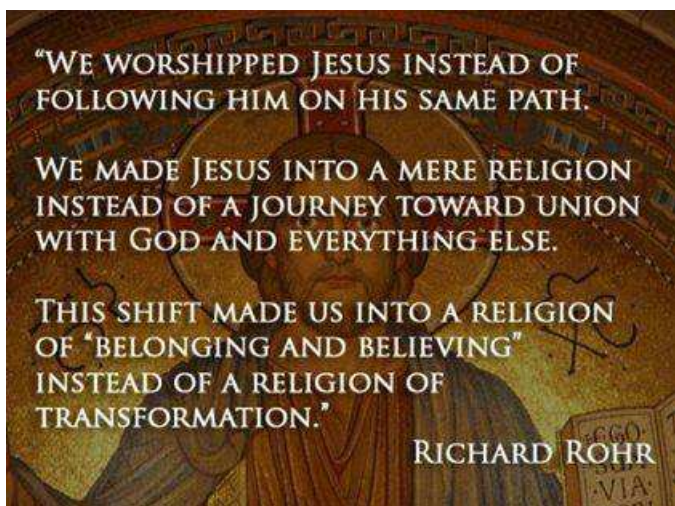

WHAT IS IT:

RETABLE & REREDOS

A retable is a raised shelf or ledge behind the altar. In churches where altar is facing and attached to the wall of the Church, the reredos is attached to or sits on the back of the altar. It may be a simple shelf for candles, altar cross and flowers, but it can also be a large and elaborate structure. Strictly speaking, we don't have a retable at Trinity, but the shelf on which we place the "altar" flowers is like a retable, but, of course, it is not immediately behind the altar.

A reredos is typically a decorative wood or stone screen or panel, or a drapery hanging behind or above or surrounding the altar. Most are very ornate with biblical scenes, statues or panels with Christian symbols. Again, we do not have a reredos at Trinity, but the Cathedral has a very ornate carved wooden reredos framing a painting of Jesus surrounded by disciples. It also has a retable.
